Love God, Serve God, Love Others, Serve Others

It anyone is in be is a new creation; the old has gone, the new 2 Corinthians 5:17

One of my goals as a

pastor is to help us all engage the world in which we live in a more profound and meaningful way. This goal begins with me personally, as I attempt to interact with the world in a way that glorifies God but also includes helping others join in this engagement to find practical ways to impact others on a consistent basis. One resource I've found to help me think more about my daily walk with God is a website called 'Theology of Work.' This site gives several tools and articles about ways to build a mindset that focuses on bringing God with us everywhere we go, and especially how we can relate to him in our vocation. A recent article about the resurrection caught my attention and I thought I'd share the main points with you.

The first point the author makes is 'The Resurrection Affirms the Goodness of the Material World.' It's important to note that Jesus wasn't a spirit or ghost after the resurrection, but that the disciples could "put [their] hand into the wound in [Jesus'] side" (John 20.27, NLT). He ate with the disciples (Luke 24.43) and walked along the road with them (Luke 24.14). Therefore the work God has given us do on earth with our hands, hearts, minds and feet is not meaningless. If we sit behind a desk all day or we dig in the soil and labor in our yards, that physical and mental work has value.

Second, we see that 'The Resurrection Demonstrates that There Is Continuity Between the Present World and New Creation.' Sometimes we think that we can treat our bodies and our planet however we want because God is going to make it all new someday anyway. And while there is some truth to that, there is also truth in that Jesus was resurrected with a physical body that was recognizable by those who knew him (Luke 24.31). 1 Corinthians 3 shows that the work that we do for God will be tested on "the Day" when Christ returns. Our work is important to show our love and grace to him and is continuous from this world into the next.

Lastly, we are told that 'The Resurrection is a Sign that New Creation, While Not Fully Realized, Has Been Initiated.' This is a complicated title that basically says our eternal lives with God start now. We should be living now as if we were living in heaven with God. 2 Corinthians 5.17 tells us, "Anyone who belongs to Christ has become a new person. The old life is gone; a new life has begun!" (NLT) Our attitude, worldview, mentality and lifestyle should already now reflect how we will live when we are fully in God's presence after our life on earth has ended.

I pray this week that we truly realize how important our daily work and efforts are in our relationship with God and the forever we plan to live with him in heaven.
