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No one likes to suffer, right? I mean

when we get pushed down or spit on we don't naturally say, "Thank you sir, may I have another?" I mean that's unnatural. It's against our desires. And no one is asking us to seek more pain, thankfully. But it's interesting that while we seek to get away from pain or force ourselves to endure it or try to fix the issue, God might have a different perspective. In fact, we most often see pain and suffering as only bad, while God may see some good in it, too.

Over the past several weeks we've been looking at a sermon series called "I Am N" which focuses on the persecuted church around the world. And in that series we looked at different aspects of how and why Christians suffer through the most horrendous experiences and life-altering situations. In the final sermon, we looked at forgiveness and in that message we found that Jesus calls us to forgive even when others hate, attack and kill us.

And that's a tough call to live up to. But I think, for me, it's a little easier to accept the pain and the hurt and offer forgiveness when we know that God is amidst the events. Not that he caused them to happen, but that he can make something beautiful out of the mess. He allows these bad things in order to help us grow. It reminds me the story at the end of Genesis about Joseph and how his brother's sold him as a slave, where he endured multiple hardships even worse than the separation from his family and people. But after all the suffering, Joseph was given a position of power and was able to save many lives because of God's providence in his life.

And at the end of Joseph's story, we see his

brothers sorrowful for what they did to him but afraid that he might seek vengeance. And Joseph, instead of being angry and vengeful, says, "You intended to harm me, but God intended it for good to accomplish what is now being done, the saving of many lives." (50.20, ESV)

Now not all of us will end up like Joseph, but God has a purpose for pain. In fact, I think God even sees it as having some good. Because God knows that we grow most when we hurt. We learn to trust him more when we suffer. We stop and reflect more if something gets in our way.

So, my prayer for me and you is suffering.

Hardship. Difficulty. I know that's the prayer you were hoping for, but even more my prayer is that in that challenge, God's work becomes increasingly apparent in our lives. And I pray that knowing that God is in the midst of that suffering can then lead us to be more ready to forgive.
