How would you define free will? Is it the ability to make any and every choice? It is entirely separate from any other factors? Is free will truly free?

I've been wrestling with the idea of free will over the past few days in an attempt to understand better God's sovereignty (or his supreme authority), especially in terms of humanity. And I've been looking at various camps that have strong views on God's sovereignty and each one has to wrestle with free will to balance out their belief. And so, how free is our will? If we were to say that we are absolutely free to do anything we want, well we know that's not true. If you think you can, go ahead and try to fly without an airplane or play a game of cards under water without an oxygen tank. Obviously there are limits to our free will in that regard. Maybe we'd say that we, then, are free to choose whatever we desire within those physical limits. And I would agree with that, we have choices in those limits, but are those choices completely free, either? I mean, wouldn't we always make the right and best choice if we were completely free? We all make choices that are impacted by a multitude of factors and emotions are a big part of that. All of us know of a time when we've responded to others out of hurt or fear or anger or selfpreservation, right? And often when we do, we don't like the choice we've made. We yell at our kids. We isolate ourselves from our spouse. We purposefully avoid an individual who wronged us. It's true when they say, "hurt people hurt people."

way, is our will really free? Are we truly agents in charge of our own choices?

But when it comes right down to it, we have choices to make. And even when we're hurt or angry or lonely or depressed, our choices are *our* choices. We are active agents in those choices. And because of that, we have responsibility for those choices and need to face the consequences of them. And as much "fun" as it is to blame everyone else for the problems we find ourselves in, we ultimately have a choice in the matter.

I think the best example for this comes from Joseph (I encourage you to read Genesis 37-50). When Joseph was sold as a slave into Egypt by those who should have loved and protected him (his brothers) he had his own choices to make. And though his circumstances were out of his control to a large extent, his good choices within those circumstances led him to power and prominence multiple times. And every time he was pushed down or forgotten by those around him, God lifted him up because Joseph continued to be faithful to God's leading.

And that's where we are at too. We may be in difficult, even awful circumstances, but we have choices to make. And those choices may be influenced by our emotions and outside forces to some extent, but we are ultimately responsible for what we choose. And as hard as those choices can be to make, my prayer is that you and I seek to follow God's leading in providing life and love to those around us. Serving Him and you, Matthew
