How do we make connections? I mean,

that's the plot of about every romantic comedy or drama ever produced, right? And connection are essential. Whether it's a romantic one or one with our friends or with our kids. But how do we connect? Most of us find some connections simple and easy. Those surface level relationships that are friendly and enjoyable that liven up our lives and hearts. And then we have a few deeper connections based upon shared experiences, family ties or a choice to love another person. And those connections make life worth living. They make it worth getting up in the morning. And though they take work and intentionality, they can give our life purpose as well.

But what I've wrestled with a little lately is how do we take that connection with others and relate it to God? I mean, personally, I don't struggle with a connection with God very often (though there have been seasons in my life that I have) I know that others don't have it come as naturally. I guess for those who might struggle, or for the times when I personally struggle, how do we take ancient stories and experiences and make them alive and active for us today? How do we connect with the experiences of men and women who lived centuries, even millennia, ago? If you're confused, just hang with me for a second. Now, I'd be the first to say that we don't just experience God through the words of those who lived in the past. We can certainly experience God now; I know I have and do. However, those experiences must also be based upon the truth that we read about from those who experienced him in the past; those who interacted with him in a profound and intimate way and especially with those who saw and spoke with God's Son Jesus. Because if our experiences of God is in conflict with

what we read and hear from those who saw and knew him more personally in the past, then I doubt it's really God we're experiencing. And so, the root of all our experience with God must lie in those stories we see in the Bible. If that's true, then the best way I see for us to experience God today is to make the stories we read in the past into a present and personal reality. In fact the Jews made it a practice to do this regularly, especially with the Passover. And though I don't claim to have a clear and perfect answer to how we do this, I do think our participation in practices and traditions help point the way, as does our connections with others. One practice in particular that's important for this connection is the Lord's Supper. But even just the consistent gathering of fellow Christians and purposeful traditions can help us connect with those stories and ultimately with God. And so, for me, it all comes down to better connections with others, something I'm working hard at. But I also know that better connections ultimately means better connecting with God and the way he's interacted with our world in the past, which lead to seeing the way he interacts with our world in the present.

And so, I pray, that you'll join me continually and regularly in that shared connection. Connecting with what God has done in the past, making him a present and personal reality, but even more connecting with what he is doing now, especially in terms of how we connect with others around us. And hopefully along the way all the connections we have in this world will deepen and make our lives even richer.
