I like to hear various points of view and even other religious beliefs. I wouldn't say I always accept them graciously, but I enjoy hearing them to contrast it with the truth in the Bible and my personal beliefs. Recently I was watching a sermon from a Unitarian Universalist sharing the basics of his faith. And it's fascinating to listen to these types of messages because it isn't argumentative or defensive, but simply an explanation of why they've accepted certain beliefs. Now, I certainly don't accept much of what they hold to be truth, and in all honesty I struggle with their purpose for meeting and the reasons they do what they do, but one idea he shared struck me. I was forced to wrestle with the idea for a while and to decide if that's something I believe, needed to adapt to or if I simply needed to reject the idea. This is what he said: "In the relationship between God and human beings, God is not the dissatisfied party." What I believe he meant was that when it comes to how God and humans interact. it wasn't God who was dissatisfied. It wasn't God who needed anything. It wasn't God who needed to solve any sort of problem, because for him there wasn't one.

And in a purely cognitive, theological way, I think that makes sense. God, who is almighty, all-powerful and complete in himself, cannot be in any way dissatisfied, right? I mean if God has or can create anything he desires, why would he be dissatisfied? My mind alone would say that he wouldn't, even couldn't, be dissatisfied. Which means, that the dissatisfied party between us and God is us.

And you might wonder why that's significant. But for me, if that's true, if we are the dissatisfied parties in our relationship with God, then we are the ones who have created a system, even a religion, to satisfy ourselves. I believe this Unitarian Universalist would suggest that my faith in Jesus is a result of a man-made desire to satisfy a need we feel in ourselves. He would argue that Christians, and other religions, have made it so that we can be satisfied by creating a set of beliefs where we can do or say or believe the right things and then be accepted by God. It's our dissatisfaction that leads to our religion. The Unitarian Universalist would say that we are already accepted by God. That we are not separated from him, as Christians believe, because of our sin. But because we're dissatisfied, we've created a way to rectify a problem that we've created. But the truth is, God is not satisfied. He is not satisfied because we repeated hear from him that there is a problem: we are separated from him. And he's not satisfied because he deeply and profoundly longs to be near us. But this dissatisfied God does not remain dissatisfied. He chose to solve the problem by sending Jesus to die for us so that we could have a relationship with him. And it is that love, that action-oriented love that solves the problem and satisfies a dissatisfied God. Serving Him and you, Matthew
