Often, we hate labels. Which is why we can now buy t-shirts without labels (tags) on them. Right? Well, those labels are annoying, too, but the labels we especially hate are the ones that others have placed on us. We don't mind labeling ourselves as much, but if someone else tries to do it for us, we often get a little defensive or even angry.

And to avoid labels is a reason we often don't speak up. We remain quiet and reserved, even when we are opposed to another person's idea or thoughts, because we don't want to be labeled in some way. And I think this is especially true for our culture today. We as Christians tend to not say much about the state of our culture and the choices of others except behind closed doors with others who agree with us. Ultimately, none of us want the label of 'judgmental' or 'self-righteous'.

I'm not saying we should be judgmental or selfrighteous by any means. And I'm not proposing that we get into people's faces or become moral police to our family and friends. However, I find myself not saying what I see as right and wrong, even when it's based on what God says, because I don't want to come across as judgmental. And obviously, there is balance here, but so much of our fear is dictated by a wrong understanding of what it means to be judgmental and self-righteous. Those terms in our culture have become less about their Webster definition and mean simply "a moral stance or criticism that makes me feel uncomfortable about myself" (Matt Walsh). And the hesitation to stand up for what we believe is understandable knowing that

assumption. But I also believe that not standing up for what we believe and the truth we find in what God has said can be equally damaging to us and others.

So, where's the balance? I don't know that I have a definite line drawn, but I know that God repeatedly teaches us to be humble. To see in ourselves the sin and the shortcomings that we face (see Matthew 7) and to hate it is where we need to start. But it also means we know what God's standard is and seek to live that out in our own lives. Modeling his love and grace to others, but being willing to express our stance and even criticism of sin in loving ways is also a part of being followers of Christ.

So, I encourage us to love well, standing up for what we believe in and not allow fear of labels to keep us from sharing our faiths or what we believe.
