What has been the biggest struggle for you these past few months?

I imagine all of us have struggled to a large extent on how to deal with this virus and the stay at home order we find ourselves just starting to come out of. And though I personally have felt some benefits, especially more time with my kids, I also know that I've struggled in various ways. But in terms of being a leader of a church my struggle has been especially challenging.

And I've struggled because I truly believe there are just as important aspects of our life as our physical health. And though I truly believe keeping our bodies healthy is important, I believe that relational and spiritual health are just as important. Even more, I believe that all areas of our lives are important to keep in balance. And so, when we choose to neglect one area over another, we can suffer just as much as if we do it the other way around.

What I mean is that though it's great to try and keep this virus from spreading and to keep people from getting sick, I also believe it's just as important to keep people connected to God and have a strong spiritual health. And, hopefully, even in quarantine we can still find ways to do that.

But even more than that, I truly believe that the most complete and holistic way for us to be spiritually healthy is to have good relational health, too. As important as it is to have personal time with God, a devotional and prayer time, it's just as important to connect with others who share our faith and help us stay connected to God. And I really honestly think that's exactly what Jesus had in mind when he gave us the two greatest commandments.

We read those in Matthew 22.37-39:
Jesus tells us, "'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' And though it seems like its two separate commands, it's really one in the same.

I was watching a video where the popular pastor Steven Furtick was speaking. He was saying that we've developed a culture where we don't interact well. We don't speak dynamically, face to face, like we should. We talk online or we only talk with those we agree with most of the time. We don't discuss difficult topics and we don't work out our differences and learn to hear from one another well.

And I say all of that to point out that we need fellow Christians to meet with regularly. Connecting and loving others is vital to our spiritual health and our love for God. And as a leader in the church I feel like I need to help facilitate that as much as possible. And I really struggle with that during this pandemic. But it also takes all of us, together, to make relationships and our community stronger. We need to seek ways to continue to connect despite the circumstances, and we need to make our relationships stronger by working through conflict in a humble and godly way.

And so I ask you to do that as much as possible. Reach out to a fellow believer and find a way to love them. It might just be a prayer or a quick call. Or it could mean making them some food or helping them pay a bill. But no matter where we're at, we need God and we need each other as much as our physical health. I pray we find ways to find holistic health, especially in this time.


