### I love VBS But apparently

I'm at the age where I get exhausted after just 2 days of it. And I'm probably doing less jumping and dancing than past years, but I struggled to get through the groups on Tuesday, so here's hoping the rest of the week goes smoothly. But it's been a good week and I'm really enjoying the theme, even though it's a bit complicated at times. The curriculum we have covers the 7 C's, which are Creation, Corruption, Catastrophe, Confusion, Christ, Cross and Consummation. We're not using all of those words with the kids this week because, frankly, I'm not sure I know what all of them mean. But we are using the concepts and how important they are for each one of us.

And it's always difficult to explain the corruption and catastrophe of our history. Often we call it 'The Fall' when Adam and Eve made the choice to disobey God and eat the fruit of the Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil. And it's hard to explain to kids how all of us fall short and the sin each one of us commits.

And it's not just hard for kids to understand, but it can be hard for us adults, too. I mean, though all of us can see the evil in the world around us, we just sometimes struggle with the evil in our own hearts. The memory verse for this lesson at VBS was **Psalm 14.3**, "They have all turned aside; together they have become corrupt; there is none who does good, not even one." And that's probably one of the most depressing verses in the Bible, and also feels like an exaggeration, right? I mean, we know there are people who do good in this world. In fact, most of us would say we do some good, right? So how can the writer here say that 'there is none who does good'? But then we look at the world and we can see that there seems to be an overwhelming amount of evil and bad compared to the good and

positive. In fact, our news is filled with negative and destructive stories and very little positive and good being done.

But even despite that, we know that God intended for this world to be much better than it currently is, too. In fact, he intended for it to be perfect. He intended for harmony. He intended for all of it to be good, all of the time. And so the fact that it isn't means that, in comparison to the perfect harmony he intended, there isn't anyone who does good. And that's awful news. And that's the corruption and catastrophe of our 7 C's. However, we also know there are two other C's that give us the Good News: Christ and Cross.

And that's what I love about the weeks of VBS where we can walk through the Gospel story. We need to hear the whole story from Creation to Consummation so we know what's happening in our world and how that impacts our life. We need the bad news so that the Good News makes sense and we can know there is an answer, a solution to our problem.

The bad news is only as bad as the solution we have to it and for the problem of sin, death, pain and sadness, the solution is perfect, absolute and dynamic.

And, so, if you haven't looked at the big picture stories of God's work in our world and reflected on the bad news, I encourage you to do so. But don't let the bad news hold you down because the Good News of what Jesus has done on the cross overshadows and overpowers any of the bad news we might have in our lives. ### community Service


