Wednesday, March 2nd marks the beginning of the Lenten, or Easter, season. And though we as a church traditionally don't really highlight this season the way other churches do, it can be an important part of the calendar, especially as we (hopefully) move away from winter and into the spring season. To help us prepare for Easter this year, we'll be doing a sermon series called "Witness" and looking at the story of Jesus' signs or miracles in the book of John. And it's these signs that John uses to show to us who Jesus is and gives us reasons for why we should believe and trust in him.

And I'm excited about that series but to help us engage in that series a little more, I want to encourage you to do a few different things over this Easter season.

First, I want to challenge you to read through the book of John from beginning to end at least once. There's only 21 chapters, so one chapter a day should get us through it at least once before Easter. As you read, I encourage you to highlight cues or stories that reveal to you how Jesus is showing himself to be the Messiah and Savior. These can be personal notes that help solidify or strengthen your faith.

Second, I want to encourage you to write out a list or a letter for why you belief and follow Jesus. I'm not looking for a research paper or a list of Bible verses, but Peter writes to us in 1 Peter 3.15, "...but in your hearts honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect..."

(ESV) Again, this isn't something that needs a lot of work and I'm not expecting anyone to turn it in to me, but we should have a reason and an answer for why we love and follow Jesus. It might not have much more to do than our own experience and the relationships we have with others, but I think there's power in writing that out or at least having some idea of what we'd tell someone who asked us.

Lastly, I want to encourage you to engage in as many services as possible. There are multiple community services and activities over the next few weeks and they are listed below and will be helpful to prepare us for Easter in different ways through different people and experiences.

So my prayer for us this Easter season is that we slow down enough to hear and experience God amid the ever increasing demands that we have on us, especially as more and more activities are coming back into our schedule. The church calendar can help us do that if we're willing to allow it to help shape our lives and our schedules, too. But either way, God wants to have more and more of our lives and our hearts and that requires us to slow down for him to engage with us. In our fast paced and frantic worlds that slowing down feels nearly impossible, but it is truly only in the quiet and slower moments that our hearts and minds can change.

And so, I'm praying that each one of us will take the considerations I'm outlining here and that we'll know and experience God in a unique way this Easter season. We still need

revival from him in an earnest and powerful way, and I'm still praying for that. I hope you'll join me.
