How many times this past couple weeks have

you complained about the weather? Now, be honest. It's probably been more than once. It's interesting how fickle we are about the weather and its unpredictable nature. But to me, weather and its cycles and rhythms are fascinating. It's interesting how much of our world goes through these changes on a relatively regular pattern each year. Though there are certain places where it's mostly the same, most of our planet has various seasons. We have four seasons, while other places have a wet and a dry season. But whatever the place, it seems God created this world with rhythms.

And God told his people to prepare for that rhythm. In the Old Testament, he commanded the Israelites to live under this cycle even beyond what the weather decreed. He told them to take regular Sabbath rests and to give the land Sabbath rest. He even commanded festivals and celebrations to go along with this rhythm.

In Ecclesiastes, the wise king Solomon wrote about these seasons in life in 3.1-8, "There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens: a time to be born and a time to die, a time to plant and a time to uproot, a time to kill and a time to heal, a time to tear down and a time to build, a time to weep and a time to laugh, a time to mourn and a time to dance, a time to scatter stones and a time to gather them, a time to embrace and a time to refrain from embracing, a time to search and a time to give up, a time to keep and a time to throw away, a time to tear and a time to mend, a time to be silent and a time to speak, a time to love and a time to hate, a time for war and a time for peace." (NIV) And we all know this is true about life, but we often don't like it. We want consistency, especially, but a known consistency.

But ultimately we want things to go good all the time. And Solomon promises some good. But we know that bad comes, too. And even when they aren't good, we want to know *when* we're going to feel pain or be unhappy and especially *when* we'll be better. We want to plan for it and schedule our lives accordingly. I think much of our struggle in our life comes because the pain was unexpected and we have no control on when it will end. But, my prayer is that we realize the rhythm of life is part of God's plan. That he created it to ebb and flow, from good to bad, happy to sad. But he also promised that it will end, even if we don't know when, and that he is aware of our struggle. He wants to be with us and he wants to love us in the dark winters just as he does in the sunny summer. I pray we learn to embrace this rhythm as something God uses to draw us near to him.
