We don't have any idea what it means to be a slave, right? I mean, even the best treated slave has no comparison to anything most of us have been through (unless you've been kidnapped or something). And so, even while we sit in our homes, forced to care for our own kids 24/7, feeding them 3 meals a day, not able to go to the park or the movies or even to work for some of us, it's still so much better than slavery. And you might wonder why I'd even compare slavery to our current situation, but I think some people get the comparison. To be restricted in this way, to be forced into simpler lives and choices, feels like our freedoms have been taken away. And, again, I don't want to push back too hard, but I do want to point out that we are getting just a taste of something others around the world deal with daily. And we still have Netflix and the internet and can pick up food at restaurants, but life isn't what it used to be. We've been forced into a different way of living, and in some ways, we might feel a little stuck, even trapped.

Henri Nouwen writes, "The state of the world suggests to me the urgent need for a spirituality that takes the end things very seriously, not a spirituality of withdrawal, nor of blindness to the powers of the world, but a spirituality that allows us to live in this world without belonging to it, a spirituality that allows us to take the joy and peace of the divine life even when we are surrounded by the powers and principalities of evil, death, and destruction. I wonder if a spirituality of liberation does not need to be deepened by a spirituality of exile or captivity." I think Nouwen's words are incredibly fitting for where we are right now. Especially when he says that we should 'find joy and peace of the divine life, even when we are surrounded by the powers...of evil, death and destruction' and that to find that joy and peace in

the midst of evil and chaos, we need to develop a deepened spirituality of exile and captivity. And, so, for me, I've found that to deepen anything spiritually, often we need to live through it and learn from personal experience. And so we have an opportunity here to grow, learn and develop a purpose, despite our circumstances right now. And, if Nouwen is right (and I think he is) in order for us to develop joy and peace, especially lasting joy and peace, we need to allow ourselves to live through and experience hard times, even exile or captivity. Which brings me back to the opening of this article. Though we don't know the depth of slavery that many experienced throughout history and even today, we can allow ourselves to experience more fully the loss of freedom and growing isolation, so that, as we experience those things, we have a deeper understanding, a deeper spirituality, of what it means to be free. And not just physically free, but free from sin and free from death, free to choose God's will and to bring his kingdom more fully into this world. This is the truest freedom. I pray that we use this time to deepen our spirituality and ultimately our relationship with Jesus. We allow this 'captivity' to bring us a better understanding of what real freedom, the freedom only Jesus can offer, feels and looks like. So that, we can find joy and peace in the midst of any situation. Serving Him and you, Matthew

# Offerings


