There's a **continual**

struggle in my life between giving my kids freedoms and keeping them safe. And I think I feel that struggle more working with kids at Family Night and subbing in the school. I want to be a parent and adult leader who encourages kids to express themselves and to try new things, especially when they have an excitement and desire for it. As a parent, I want to encourage my kids to explore their thoughts and to be able to help them achieve a dream or idea they have.

However, there are times where that can cost us something, either physically, emotionally or financially. And though some of those costs are just the price we have to pay, I obviously don't want my kids to get hurt in the process of pursuing some of the ideas and dreams. And then there are the kids when I sub. For the younger kids, I have no problem telling them no when they ask for something that I'm not sure they should have or be doing. But in the High School, when they ask permission to do various things, I have a little bit of a harder time saving 'No'. Part of it is I want them to be respected as older and being able to make their own choices, and then allow them to face the consequences of their actions. But I also want them to be where they should be and do the things they're supposed to do.

And so, I often let the kids go where they ask to go even if I'm not sure they should be there. Granted, I don't let them leave the building or climb on top of the roof or anything like that, but if they ask to go into another classroom I allow it assuming that they can be there and then making them face the consequences if they're doing something they shouldn't.

And I think that's a little bit like God, too.

Though God doesn't intervene when we make poor choices directly and we don't need to ask him permission to leave the room, but he has given us people, tools and guidelines to help us navigate this world well.

As children, God has given us people in our life who should guide and direct us. That's why families are so important, both mom and dad as well as extended family, even older siblings. But God has also given us a community where we live, who are also supposed to help us through our life.

But then God gives us guidelines and commands in the Bible that help guide us through the best path in this world. Through those regulations we can find more peace and contentment as well as better relationships in this world.

And so God is that loving parent who provides us with these things in order for us to prosper as much as possible in this world. And though he's never going to get in the way of our free choice, when we willingly follow his guidelines we ultimately have the most freedom possible. As Paul writes in Galatians 5.1, "It is for freedom that Christ has set us free." And so, let us live that life of freedom, using God's people, guidelines and Spirit to navigate this world to live the best life we can in this world. But most importantly, let's make sure we keep our eyes on Jesus, because no matter what else we have in our life, he is the only path to a better life after this one.
