How do you feel when you hear the word 'hate'? Does it make your skin crawl? Do you squirm in your chair or feel a burning in your heart? (those might have more to do with your supper last night, though) But, honestly, that word is filled with quite a bit of tension, isn't it? Especially if you've been a part of a church for a while, and especially if you're below the age of 35, the word 'hate' often makes us feel uncomfortable.

So, then, how does the words from Catholic Bishop Robert C. Morlino strike you:

Such wickedness should be hated with a perfect hatred. Christian charity itself demands that we should hate wickedness just as we love goodness.

And regardless of what he's referring to (I'm not going to fill you in, feel free to research it yourself), those are powerful words. Emphatic words. Words that we struggle to balance well. Especially when Morlino mentions that hate is charity, which we would call Christian love. He is saying that Christian love demands a hatred of wickedness.

So what do we do with that? In a world that seems to value tolerance and 'just getting along' above all else, hatred seems to have been taken out of the equation. To hate would seem to be unloving. To hate seems against Christ.

But is that really true? Should we not hate anything? Well, I would say, absolutely not. In fact, we get an image from Paul in Romans 12.3 about that very subject. And his words seem to be echoed in Morlino's words, "Love must be

sincere. Hate what is evil; cling to what is good." (NIV)

Sincere love, or charity as Morlino calls it, is only sincere if it is true and honest. It is only sincere if we truly hate the evil and cling to the good. So, how do we hate? What do we hate? We hate anything that is opposed to life. We hate anything that is opposed to Christ. We hate anything that brings destruction and chaos and death. In fact, it is loving to hate these things.

And, hopefully, we can all agree on that. And if we do, that means what we do, that action we take, must match that as well. If we say we are love, and therefore hate evil, do we continue to do evil things? Do we continue to hurt others, not maliciously or purposefully, as much as in our apathy or in our indifference?

As followers of Christ, then, I call us to hate. Not hate others, but hate the evil that brings about damage, destruction and death in its various forms. And I call us to live a life that reveals that hatred for those things. And in doing so we bring love.
