What's next? These last few weeks, even months, have been one of the most trying times universally for us, right? Most of us have probably asked 'what's next?' more than once recently. Whether it's what the governor mandates or the weather dictates or life simply obligates it feels like we are in a constant state of limbo. And in these unprecedented times, there's really no one to blame. I mean, we blame all sorts of people, but I honestly don't believe much blame can be passed out. Most of us are just trying to navigate the times as best we can. And then something audaciously tragic happens like the loss of a godly and wonderful woman and three innocent little boys. And though we could point the finger at one particular person (maybe) there were so many factors that had to fall into place for this to happen the way that it did. But in the days and weeks following that tragedy, we probably asked 'what's next?' even more. Maybe we might even say, 'I don't know how much more I can take'.

And I get that. I really do. I know my own experience these past few months, but especially these last couple weeks, I've asked some questions. I've struggled with some doubts and I don't know that I've come to much of a resolution. I've appreciated those who have checked in on me but honestly I don't know how to respond usually. And I guess that's my point; I'm not sure how I'm doing.

In some ways things are going fine for me. Even good. I sleep well usually and I'm not overly stressed. But, also, I'm not sure I'm fully experiencing what is happening around me. And the reason I share this is that I doubt I'm alone. I doubt I'm the only one who feels like

we're just floating through time, waiting for things to change and not really experiencing or feeling the full weight of our circumstances. And I think that's probably a natural part of how God made us to help us cope with these types of things.

But then I remind myself that I always need to keep coming back to truth, especially in a time and world where truth seems hard to come by. I need to remind myself that, even if this is our new normal, even if our lives don't go 'back' to whatever they were before April and tragedy continues to happens on top of tragedy...(\*deep breath)...I can keep going. I need to remember that all of those experiences are happening above the surface, in the atmosphere, so to speak. Because the ground, the foundation, for me always has to be the same. And my feet are squarely placed on solid ground.

Psalm 18.2 says, "The Lord is my solid rock, my fortress, my rescuer. My God is my rock – I take refuge in him!" And in Matthew 7, Jesus tells us to build our lives on the solid foundation of putting his words into practice. And so, even if my emotions aren't sure what's going on and my mind can't comprehend the situation and circumstances, and especially when I ask, 'what's next?' I know that my feet don't need to be shaken. My feet stand strong on a foundation as old as time, as long as I remember my God, his promises and the hope I have in him...and takes steps to follow after him.
